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

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DAY ONE:

## *What is a Revival?*

**Alternative Expressions for Revival:** Recovery, Revitalise, Restoration, Reawakening

**Definition:** The process of bringing back to life, consciousness or full strength. The awakening of religious fervour (passion, dedication, enthusiasm, eagerness, zeal or commitment).

Revival is for the glory of God and the honour of His name. It is then for the Church, the body of Christ so that they can be revived and live holy upright lives. The Holy Spirit will be given His rightful place in the Church which may cause Divine disorder as the Refiner comes and sifts and shakes. Out of this and during the same period of time, those who are outside the Church, non-Christians, come under deep convictions of sin, regardless of whether they are in a church building or within the sound of a preacher or evangelist and will surrender their lives to Jesus Christ and live for Him in holiness and righteousness.

Dr Martin Lloyd-Jones, preaching on Exodus 33:18-23; Moses desiring to see God's glory, said "That's a perfect description of a revival; it's the glory of God passing by. That's precisely what it is, just this glimpse of God as He passes by. The God who is there in the glory, as it were comes down, pays a visit, pours out His Spirit, descends again, and He just passes by us, and we look on and feel and know that the glory of God is in the midst and is passing by, O' it's but a touching of the hem as it were, it's but a vision of the back...a revival I say is just a kind of touch of His glory, a fleeting glimpse of something of what He is, in and of Himself...these things are possible and these things are meant for us."

### **Thoughts to Ponder on Today:**

Do you really want this for yourself, your Church, family, friends and the unsaved? Let's make this the focus of today. Ask the Lord to let the revival begin in you this week.

**Scriptures for Today:** Psalm 85: 6-8, Acts 2:1-18 and 41, 7, Acts 16:25-34

DAY SIX:

## *Faith & Thanksgiving in Advance*

**Alternative Expressions for Advance:** Early, Upfront, Beforehand, Before an event takes place.

**Definition:** Done or happening before an event.

Do thoughts such as: *how do I praise God before anything happens? I'd feel silly if I did and then nothing even happens. Right now I just don't feel like doing this?*

Isn't it funny how we can say thanks in advance to a friend on the phone who has kindly agreed to help us out with a task next week and sometimes we close our emails by saying "*thanks in advance.*" Even though nothing has been promised and we can easily be let down in these circumstances, we still manage to comfortably say thank you because we faith in that person. So, why do we find it hard to take on this approach with God even though His Word tells us that He is faithful and cannot lie to us? (1 Corinthians 1:9, Numbers 23:19)

It all comes down to our faith. Do we really believe God will do what he said He will do? Are we at a place in our relationship with God where we can say: *Thank you Lord for what will take place in our lives. Thank you in advance for the healing, deliverance and restoration.*"

### **Thoughts to Ponder on Today:**

Notice that before Jesus fed the 5000 with just 5 loaves and 2 fishes, He gave thanks first in faith and look what happened. (John 6:11-12)

Make a list of the things that you are hoping for and step out in faith by giving thanks in advance. If you are struggling with your faith, ask God to help you to increase it today.

**Scriptures for Today:** 2 Chronicles 20:17-19, 21-22 and 25, Hebrews 10:23, Hebrews 11: 1, Proverbs 3:5, Luke 18:41-43

DAY THREE:

## *One Accord & Unity*

**Alternative Expressions for Unity:** Agreement, Union, Accord, Harmony

**Definition:** The state or condition of being one, combining or joining of separate things or entities to form one.

We are all different, God made us that way. In the body of Christ not everyone will agree on opinions and ideas, but this by no means diminishes our commitment to God. The Greek word for one accord comes from the words “homo” meaning “the same” and “thumos” which means “passion”. Therefore when we all have the same passion we are on one accord.

Regardless of how great a vocal group sound, when someone in the band sings out of tune, the sound coming from that one person singing off key has the power to affect the harmonious sound of the rest of the singers. Amazing things happened in the Bible when people came together on ‘one accord’. Their unity and mutual passion was an important element to their success. In Mark 2: 1-5 four men assisted a paralysed man to help him to receive his healing. Obviously the sick man wanted to be healed, but the incredible thing about this text is that all of the men must have had a passion to get him to Jesus. Perhaps the sick man had more than four people around him to help in the beginning, but possibly because of the large crowd and their lack of faith they gave up hope. However, we do know that there were four men who were dedicated to helping him. Their persistence and faith caused them to get the paralysed man through the roof, to get to Jesus to receive his healing. Jesus recognised this, He saw something special about the collective the faith that these men had conveyed. Each of the 4 men had an important part to play in the sick man’s healing.

### **Thoughts to Ponder on Today:**

Do we share the same passion to see a change in our lives, the church, our families and friends? Do we all have that desire to encounter that awesome Pentecostal experience? Let pray for unity in the body of Christ.

**Scriptures for Today:** Acts 2:1-4, Acts 4:24-33, 1 Cor 1:10, Eph 4:3, Ecc 4:9-12

DAY FOUR:

## *Deliverance & Restoration*

**Alternative Expressions for Deliverance:** Release, freedom, escape, rescue, liberate, relief

**Definition:** Rescue from captivity, hardship or domination by evil.

Deliverance is not just about casting out demons. There are many other hindrances in our lives that we need to be set free from. Are there things in your life that you just can’t seem to shake off? Do you have barriers that hold you back from walking in victory? Are they becoming an obstacle to getting to the place where you want to be in God?

In most cases, these issues attach themselves to us for a long period of time, causing us to feel as if our problems are never-ending. The continuous timeframe can make us feel as if God is unable to solve our problems. Thoughts such as the following will cause us to doubt:

*“Things are never going to change for me; I’ve had this problem for too long. I might as well accept it. This is the way it’s always been and I can’t imagine anything supernatural happening. To be honest, I just don’t believe that God can handle this particular problem.”*

We allow these thoughts to settle in comfortably into our minds when we should be rejecting them. You can easily give satan a foothold in your mind by dwelling on negative thoughts. Sometimes the root cause of us not receiving our deliverance is because we have accepted satan’s lies, they prevents us from stepping out in faith to getting to a place of freedom. God is all powerful and nothing is too hard for Him. (Jeremiah 32:27). The Lord even has the power to changes hearts and mind sets (Ezekiel 36:26 and 1 Samuel 10:9).

### **Thoughts to Ponder on Today:**

What is in your life that you need deliverance from? Are you letting the enemy get in the way of your freedom? Do you believe that God has the power to restore and set us free? Tell Him all about it in your prayers today.

**Scriptures for Today:** Joel 2: 24-28, Luke 8:27-39, 43-48, Luke 13:11-13, Haggai 2:6-9

DAY FIVE:

## *Breaking Chains & Strongholds*

**Alternative Expressions for Stronghold:** *Fortress (a defensible place)*

**Definition:** A demonic fortress of thoughts which accommodates evil spirits that control, dictate and influence your attitudes and behaviour. These thoughts can oppress and discourage you, they also effect how you view or react to circumstances, people and situations.

Strongholds are a powerful influence over a person's life; they can cause you to entertain certain thoughts and participate in activities that are contrary to the will of God. Sometimes they can cause us to see God incorrectly (believing that He is unforgiving or having an unhealthy fear of God) they also can cause us to believe lies about ourselves (low self-esteem, depression etc).

The Greek word for stronghold is ochyroma – a fortification such as a castle, some translate this as prison.

After being incarcerated for a long time, an offender was released from prison. Even though he was now physically free, he had a problem grasping his new found freedom. At home he couldn't sleep with his bedroom door closed because when this happened; it psychologically brought him back to the lonely, frightening place he was in while he was locked away. This is how the enemy works, he manages to distort the truth by presenting lies that we start to believe are factual.

The word break means to snap off or detach, it can also be used to describe the disruption of continuity. Isaiah 9:4 tells us that God has the power to break yokes (spiritual chains or bondage). There is nothing too hard for our God!

### **Thoughts to Ponder on Today:**

Do you realise that prayer and fasting can break strongholds? What are the strongholds in your life? Offer them up to Him and meditate on scriptures that will encourage you to believe that God is able to break all chains. Speak to God about them today.

**Scriptures for Today:** Mark 9:28-29, Isaiah 58:6, Zac 4:6, 2 Cor 10:4-5

DAY TWO:

## *Forgiveness & Consecration*

**Alternative Expressions for Consecration:** Sanctification, Hallowing, Dedication

**Definition:** To declare or set something apart as holy. To dedicate something for a specific purpose.

Do have a desire for God to use you in a mighty way? Do you have a passion to see souls saved? Right now, at this very moment, can you imagine God looking down on your life and smiling? Does your life make Him smile? If not, then realise that every child of God has the privilege of obtaining forgiveness instantly by a simple, honest prayer said with faith.

Imagine yourself as a tap and the Holy Spirit as the water, the water cannot run through the tap if there is blockage. In order for the water to flow freely the blockage must be cleared. If we want the Holy Spirit to move freely through ourselves and the church, we must ensure that all spiritual blockages are cleared.

These blockages could represent a lack of faith or anything that displeases God. The Lord desires for us to be a river of living water, (*John 7:35*) not a tap. Taps get turned on and off, the supply is controlled by man, but a river is a constant stream that it does not start and stop because its flow is plentiful. We should not wait for special occasions to practice living a consecrated life; this should be our aim on a daily basis.

### **Thoughts to Ponder on Today:**

What could be blocking your "flow"? What changes will you make today to allow a constant, plentiful flow in your life? While you are abstaining from food today, what will you fill yourself with for God? Will it be more of His Word and more of quality time with Him? Ask God for forgiveness, so He can wipe your slate clean. Request for help to live a constant consecrated life that makes Him smile.
